NEED-BASED FINANCIAL AID

File the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online at fafsa.ed.gov in order to apply for need-based financial aid. **SLU's FAFSA school code is 002506.** The FAFSA priority deadline for summer and fall applicants is Feb. 1 and Nov. 1 for spring applicants.

FINANCIAL AID AWARDS

A+ Award
\$3,000 per year

The A+ Award has a value of \$3,000 per year and can be combined with other merit-based University scholarships. This award is available to transfer students who were designated as A+ eligible with their high school and are attending an A+ participating community college in Missouri. It is renewable over a maximum of six semesters.

Community College Award
\$2,000 per year

The Community College Award has a value of \$2,000 per year and can be combined with other merit-based University scholarships. This award is available to transfer students who are currently attending or most recently attended a community college. It is renewable over a maximum of six semesters.

MERIT-BASED SCHOLARSHIPS

Jesuit Transfer Scholarship

\$10,000-\$18,000 per year

This tiered scholarship is awarded to students who have the following cumulative GPA in previous college coursework:

+ 2.8-2.99 GPA receives \$10,000

+ 3.2-3.49 GPA receives \$16,000

+ 3.0-3.19 GPA receives \$14,000

+ 3.5-4.0 GPA receives \$18,000

The Jesuit Transfer Scholarship is renewable over a maximum of six semesters.

Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship

\$1,000 per year

This award is given to students who present at least a 3.0 cumulative GPA in previous college coursework, have at least 60 transferable college credit hours (or an associate's degree) and whose Phi Theta Kappa advisor confirms his or her good standing with Phi Theta Kappa in a letter to the Office of Admission. The Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship is renewable over a maximum of six semesters and may be combined with other scholarships awarded by the University.

Billiken, Ignatian, University, Deans' or Vice Presidents' Scholarships

\$8,000-\$23,000 per year

Transfer students who have completed fewer than 24 transferable credit hours by the time they start at SLU will be given consideration for a freshman merit-based scholarship. In determining what transfer status applies to your situation, you should take into account those college credit hours you have attempted or are in the process of attempting at the time of your application. These scholarships are renewable over a maximum of seven semesters for eligible transfer students.

COMPETITIVE SCHOLARSHIPS

John Paul Fechter Service Scholarship

The John Paul Fechter Service Scholarship recognizes new transfer students who have demonstrated significant dedication to community service.

+ 2.5 cumulative GPA in previous college coursework

+ 30 transferable college credit hours

+ Demonstration of significant involvement in community service

*\$10,000 per year; can be combined with other University scholarships; **April 1 application deadline***

Martin Luther King Jr. Scholarship

SLU's Martin Luther King Jr. Scholarship is an academic award offered to students who have demonstrated leadership as agents of change or influence within their school and/or community activities.

+ Completion of at least 24 credit hours of transferable college coursework

+ Cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher as calculated by Saint Louis University

*Minimum total value: \$13,000 per year; can be combined with other University scholarships; **Feb. 1 application deadline***

SUBMIT OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPTS

Request transcripts from every college or university you've attended, even if those credits appear as transferred-in credit on a later transcript. Transcripts can be sent to SLU electronically or mailed to the Office of Admission.

+ Students who have **completed fewer than 24 hours** of transferable college credit or who have graduated high school within a year of the term for which they are applying must submit an official high school transcript and ACT or SAT scores as well. Test scores can be sent electronically or included with the official high school transcript. Self-reported scores will also be considered.

MAKE SLU YOUR HOME

Housing is available to transfer students who wish to live on campus. SLU has a residency requirement for freshman- and sophomore-level students. Students who live within a 25-mile radius of campus may be eligible for an exemption to the housing requirement. See slu.edu/housing for more information about our seven residence halls and four apartment complexes.



GPA CALCULATION

Saint Louis University calculates each transfer applicant's cumulative GPA using the information presented on all college transcripts at the time of application. The cumulative GPA calculated by the University (which may not correspond with the cumulative GPA that appears on an individual transcript) is used in both admission and scholarship review.

In general, all completed college course grades are used by the University to compute your cumulative GPA. Courses with a grade below a C and courses from institutions that do not meet the University's accreditation requirements will not transfer for credit to Saint Louis University but will be included in the computation of your cumulative GPA.
